All the changes were worth it and we got a lot of space at present. Here are the pictures:



In the next newsletter he will report about his stay here. He will be greatly missed here.

In addition to the clinic, we have started to run a small farm. It covers our own needs and saves money for the purchase of vegetables. Tomatoes, cucumbers, squash, peanuts, watermelons, eggplant, avocado, Ampalaya and others grow very well and we had the first year good harvest.









Through the generous funding of the Organization of German Dentist (Hilfswerk Deutscher Zahnärzte) headed by Dr. Winter, we were able to build a treatment and swim-learning pool in July 2012. It is unique in North - Samar and we are very grateful to the Organisation. The idea to build it came thru an increasing number of swimming accidents in Bugko. 80% of the Filipinos don't know how to swim, we frequently got drowned children brought to the clinic whom we could not save anymore. Swimming lessons in schools are not taught and by here undercurrents in the sea, the children quickly In addition it will be used as a therapy - or rehabilitation pool, because we also have many patients with paralysis after stroke and accidents. Guided water treatment will help them to improve their motoric skills.

















From August 21-24 Klaus De Cassan and his wife Michaela were here with us. Dr. De Cassan come already many times to train our volunteers in the fluoride prophylaxis program. This time, he instructed them with o the new tooth cleaning devices. These were also donated by the Association of German Dentists (Hilfswerk der deutschen Zahnärzte), so we can expand our services in the dental clinic here and work continuous to stop the usual catastrophic dental hygiene here.







August 30 and 31 we had again a medical / surgical mission. This time, five doctors from Manila came with different specializations. We cooperated with "International Initiative for Philippines", which has its headquarters in New York. The large flow of patients was overwhelming. In addition to medical examinations, minor surgical procedures were performed on an outpatient basis. Our volunteers worked tirelessly so that we could register a total of 586 patients and provide them with drugs for free. Before six o`clock in the morning, the first patients arrived and waited patiently often several hours just to see a doctor and to be treated. The medical care in Northern Samar is still insufficient. We see it every day in our normal clinical practice, since patients often travel about 50 km, only to come to us. On August 31, we were surprised by an earthquake measuring 7.7. The epicenter was in Eastern Samar, not so far away from us. Everything shook and the transformer outside the house swang like a church bell. As a result, many people here fled to the mountains and inland, especially as a tsunami warning was issued. In one hand they had a cooking pot, in the other a child, while others took the motorbike or bycicle. The evacuation went on all night and the next morning the people came back to their homes. Unfortunately, some thieves also took advantage of the situation. Catarman, the capital of the island had the most incidents.

Thank God we did not suffer any structural damage and also our neighbors were spared. We had stayed in the clinic, in case our help was needed. It was scary and thankfully after our mission, otherwise surely there would be a major panic among the patients.











We are happy that we could help so many. Thank you all again because only by your support that everything became possible for us to do. So once again, Salamat (Thank you) to all of you from Bugko!
